PROCEEDINGS OF THE FOSTER COUNTY BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS

November 8th, 2018

At 3:30pm, Chairman Pat Copenhaver called the Foster County Commission meeting to order. Roll call included Commissioner Pat Copenhaver, Commissioner Alan Scanson, Commissioner David Utke, Commissioner Scott Beumer and Commissioner Becky Hagel via phone. Also present were Road Superintendent Nate Monson, Auditor Brad Solberg, Sheriff Justin Johnson, Emergency Manager Jess Earle, Tax Director Karen Evans, and Foster County Independent Reporter Leasa Lura.

The meeting began with approval of the minutes. Commissioner Utke made a motion to approve the minutes of the October 16th, 2018 meeting, seconded by Commissioner Scanson. All voted aye and the motion passed.

Commissioner Scanson made a motion to approve the bills, seconded by Commissioner Beumer. All voted aye, and the motion passed.

Commissioner Beumer made a motion to approve the agenda, seconded by Commissioner Scanson. All voted aye and the motion passed.

New Business

Road Superintendent Nate Monson told the BOCC that the Road Department has finished blading gravel roads and getting rid of windrows. Monson stated that they are still durapatching spots on highways. Monson brought the sealant quotes for 2019 crack sealing:

Quote 1-Mid States- \$0.595/lb. if purchase ½ load-estimated 23,500lbs (10 pallets)--\$13,982.50 delivered Quote 2-Normont- \$0.72/lb. if purchase ½ load-estimated 21,000lbs (10 pallets)--\$15,120.00 delivered Commissioner Scanson made a motion to approve the Quote from Mid States for \$13,982.50, seconded by Commissioner Utke. All voted aye and the motion passed.

Monson stated that he is looking for a dually pickup for the Road Department and that there is a State Sale coming up with one for sale. Commissioner Utke made a motion to allow Monson to spend up to \$18,000 on a dually pickup for the Road Department, seconded by Commissioner Scanson. All voted aye and the motion passed.

Tax Director Karen Evans approached the BOCC with an abatement for Daryl Rask. Evans stated that they wanted to change their value from 120,600 to 116,480. Commissioner Utke made a motion to approve the abatement, seconded by Commissioner Scanson. All voted aye and the motion passed.

Evans also brought a new contract from Sidwell to the BOCC. This new contract is Soil Services Contract. Commissioner Beumer made a motion to approve the Soil Services Contract, seconded by Commissioner Scanson.

Evans also brought a renewal contract from Sidwell for the GIS Maintenance. Commissioner Utke made a motion to approve the GIS Maintenance Service Contract, seconded by Commissioner Scanson. All voted aye and the motion passed.

Sheriff Johnson approached the BOCC about a new vehicle. Johnson stated that he had budgeted for the new vehicle. Johnson stated that he got quotes from three different Chevrolet dealers and Bessette Motors matched the best price, so he has decided to purchase through Bessette Motors. Commissioner Scanson made a motion to allow

Sheriff Johnson to purchase a Tahoe through Bessette Motors, seconded by Commissioner Beumer. All voted aye and the motion passed.

Auditor Brad Solberg brought the NDPERs Sanford Health Insurance Renewal to the BOCC. Commissioner Hagel made a motion to approve the renewal for the Sanford Health Insurance, seconded by Commissioners Scanson. All voted aye and the motion passed.

Emergency Manager approached the BOCC about approving her Section 324 notice for the newspaper. Commissioner Scanson made a motion to approve the Section 324 notice, seconded by Commissioner Beumer. All voted aye and the motion passed.

Commissioner Hagel had spoken with Grondahl Recreation about purchasing the Foster County Park equipment before the end of the year when prices change. Commissioner Hagel made a motion to approve the purchase of the Foster County Park equipment with a full load of Engineered Wood Fiber for a price of \$19,371.00 seconded by Commissioner Beumer. All voted aye and the motion passed.

Auditor Solberg was approached by members of the courthouse asking if the Foster County Courthouse would be closed on Christmas Eve. The State of ND, the Court system, Cass County, and Stutsman County will all be closed the full day. Commissioner Beumer made a motion to close the Foster County Courthouse all day on Christmas Eve, seconded by Commissioner Hagel. All voted aye and the motion passed.

Commissioner Utke wanted to know if the BOCC should lobby with the State Legislatures about getting new voting equipment. Auditor Solberg stated that the North Dakota County Auditors Association will be lobbying for new equipment during the next session. Commissioner Scanson stated that he would like the District 29 representatives at a Foster County Board meeting to discuss new election equipment.

With no further business, Chairman Copenhaver moved to adjourn the meeting.
