At 3:30pm, Vice-Chairman Becky Hagel called the Foster County Commission meeting to order. Roll call included Commissioner Alan Scanson, Commissioner Becky Hagel, Commissioner Pat Copenhaver, Commissioner Scott Beumer and Commissioner David Utke (via phone). Also present were Road Superintendent Nate Monson, Auditor Brad Solberg, States Attorney Kara Brinster, and Foster County Independent Reporter Leasa Lura.

The meeting began with approval of the minutes. Commissioner Scanson made a motion to approve the minutes of the February 18<sup>th</sup>, 2020 meeting seconded by Commissioner Beumer. All voted aye and the motion passed.

Commissioner Copenhaver made a motion to approve the agenda, seconded by Commissioner Beumer. All voted aye and the motion passed.

## Old Business

Auditor Solberg informed the BOCC that the Public Health Janitorial position has been filled.

## New Business

Nate Monson, Road Superintendent, informed the BOCC that the Road Dept has plowed 1 inch of snow since the last meeting. Monson informed the BOCC that the road dept has had no major or minor repairs on equipment since the last meeting. Monson informed the BOCC that the road crew ready to start crack sealing as soon as it warms up. Monson also stated that the surrounding counties will be placing their load restrictions when the state of North Dakota puts theirs on. Commissioner Beumer made a motion to put load restrictions on in Foster County when the state of North Dakota does, seconded by Commissioner Copenhaver. All voted aye and the motion passed. Mike Rivinius of Wold Engineering presented options of 74<sup>th</sup> Ave culvert. To tear up the pavement and lower the culvert would cost \$75,000, and to bore would cost \$100,000. Divide County called and wants to purchase an old MC Tank at the Glenfield Shop. Commissioner Scanson made a motion to consider selling the tank, seconded by Commissioner Hagel. All voted aye and the motion passed. Monson brought an advertisement for bids for a new motor grader. Commissioner Copenhaver made a motion to approve the ad and put it out for bids, seconded by Commissioner Scanson. All voted aye and the motion passed.

Librarian Michele Seil and Library Board Member approached the BOCC about a possible city/county joint library. There would be two ways that this could happen. First would be a ballot question to ask the people their opinion. Second would be to have a contract between the two entities. Auditor Solberg informed the BOCC that the filing deadline for the June Ballot would be April 6<sup>th</sup>, 2020 at 4:00pm. The BOCC said they needed more information before making any decisions.

Tax Equalization Director Karen Evans gave an update on the Vanguard Appraisal. Evans stated that she sent out notices of increase to all individuals. Evans also stated that all Equalization meetings have been set and handed out a list of times and dates.

Auditor Brad Solberg presented EAPC's notice to bid on the cornice project. Commissioner Copenhaver made a motion to approve the notice, second by Commissioner Beumer. All voted aye and the motion passed. Solberg than asked the BOCC about Health Insurance for Commissioners. The consensus was that Commissioners would be treated like FT employees.

Commissioner Utke gave a brief update on SIRN 20/20. Utke also asked that EM Aaron Devereaux be appointed the proxy for NW Crib. Commissioner Scanson made a motion to have Devereaux be appointed the proxy for the NW Crib, seconded by Commissioner Beumer All voted aye and the motion passed.
