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Auditor Solberg presented two lost check affidavits to the BOCC. The first one was for Alan Scanson. Commissioner Beumer made a motion to approve the lost check affidavit for Alan Scanson. All voted aye and the motion passed. The second one was for Runnings. Commissioner Scanson made a motion to approve the lost check affidavit for Runnings, seconded by Commissioner Copenhaver. All voted aye and the motion passed.

Commissioner Copenhaver made a motion to approve the agenda, seconded by Commissioner Scanson. All voted aye and the motion passed.

Old Business

Discussion was had on the County Gravel Pit. This had been passed to another person at the State of North Dakota.

New Business

The BOCC discussed low COVID-19 cases and high rollout of vaccine in North Dakota. The BOCC urged people to still follow CDC guidelines with masks and social distancing.

Commissioner Hagel asked to have Township contracts added to the Commissioner Goals. Ideas to include contract for plowing, and interest for non-payment.

Commissioner Hagel was approached by the Carrington Hospital about another grant opportunity for park equipment. There would be no match from the county level, and they would look to get more picnic tables. Commissioner Beumer made a motion to allow Commissioner Hagel to apply for the grant, seconded by Commissioner Scanson. All voted aye and the motion passed.

Karen Evans, Tax Director, approached the BOCC about Sidwell changes for 2021. Sidwell determined that the changes that needed to be made were not a part of the original contract and asked the BOCC to pay an additional \$9,900 to complete the project. The BOCC asked Evans to provide all emails to States Attorney Brinster to look into the original contract. No motions were made.

Evans then asked the BOCC to keep up the Vanguard Web Access site for the public to view values. Evans stated she has received lots of calls from realtors to keep it updated. Commissioner Beumer made a motion to approve the 5-year contract for \$1,500/year with vanguard, seconded by Commissioner Copenhaver. All voted aye and the motion passed.

Evans presented the maintenance bill from Vanguard for \$7,500 to the BOCC for approval. Commissioner Beumer made a motion to approve the bill from Vanguard, seconded by Commissioner Scanson. All voted aye and the motion passed.

Evans gave a department update, credit forms have been sent out, assessing year ends 2/1/2021, and Vanguard reps will be here to go over sales ratio study.

Mark Schneider resigned from the Foster County Water Board in January of 2021. Commissioner Hagel stated that Brent Bachmeier was proposed to be the member by the Foster County Water Board. Commissioner Beumer made a motion to approve Brent Bachmeier as the newest member of the Foster County Water Board, seconded by Commissioner Copenhaver. All voted aye and the motion passed.
