At 3:30pm, Chairman Hagel called the Foster County Commission meeting to order. Roll call included Commissioner Alan Scanson, Commissioner Becky Hagel, Commissioner Pat Copenhaver, Commissioner David Utke, and Commissioner Scott Beumer. Also present were Auditor Brad Solberg, Road Superintendent Nate Monson, States Attorney Kara Brinster and Foster County Independent Reporter Leasa Lura.

The meeting began with approval of the minutes. Commissioner Beumer made a motion to approve the minutes of the January 19th, 2021 meeting, seconded by Commissioner Scanson. All voted aye and the motion passed.

Auditor Solberg asked to have sick transfer added to the agenda. Commissioner Scanson made a motion to approve the agenda, seconded by Commissioner Beumer. All voted aye and the motion passed.

Old Business

Discussion was had on the County Gravel Pit. Nothing new to report.

New Business

Nate Monson, Road Superintendent, mentioned to the BOCC that there has been little to no maintenance needed since the last meeting. Monson provided an estimate from Wold Engineering for the North Bordulac Road. This estimate did include a breakout at the bottom of the page showing what the County's Cost would be with and without the COVID Funds available through the NDDOT. Commissioner Beumer made a motion to approve using the COVID Funds of \$42,409.90 to do the project with the County Funds being \$70,210.00, seconded by Commissioner Scanson. All voted aye and the motion passed.

Commissioner Hagel asked for each Commissioner to bring back recaps from their committee meetings that they attend through the year.

Kip Kovar, Garrison Diversion Engineer, went over the RRVWSP with the BOCC.

Karen Evans, Tax Equalization Director, brought in an Abatement for Richard Erickson. This abatement lowered the value due to land being under water. Commissioner Beumer made a motion to approve the abatement, seconded by Commissioner Scanson. All voted aye and the motion passed.

Evans approached the BOCC about the Sidwell Contract. Brinster reviewed the contract and believes that Sidwell is responsible for the overages. The BOCC asked Commissioner Beumer to work with Brinster and Evans and coming up with a deal with Sidwell.

Lisa Hilbert, Public Health Administrator, approached the BOCC about purchasing a laminator using COVID funds. Commissioner Beumer made a motion to approve the purchase of the laminator for 2,037.78, seconded by Commissioner Scanson. All voted aye and the motion passed.

Hilbert approached the BOCC about purchasing a new backup vaccine fridge for Public Health. The current backup fridge does not keep cool enough temps to maintain the safety of vaccines. Commissioner Beumer made a motion to approve the purchase of a new fridge for \$799, seconded by Commissioner Scanson. All voted aye and the motion passed.

With no further business, Commissioner Utke adjourned the meeting at 5:01pm.
